Hazards arising from activity	Control measure(s) in place to reduce risk from each hazard during activity	Arrangements to ensure the control measure(s) are effective
Slips, trips and falls	Briefing on controlled movement to slow progress down on course Suitable footwear worn Course designed to naturally manage speed of participants	<p>Appropriate training for staff and procedures to be reviewed annually or as necessary by staff and technical advisor</p> <p>Activity programme assessed each day with team briefing to take account of (but not limited to): Group, Weather and conditions</p> <p>All lead Instructors hold a current First Aid Certificate.</p>
Falling off obstacles including Slacklines	Use of spotters so students work in small teams to support Minimise trip hazards on course Slacklines to be rigged under 1m high	
Bouncy Castle (trips, collisions, falls, entrapment) (if hired use in conjunction with hirers RA)	Supervised use, age/size grouping, anchor secured, no flips, max occupancy enforced to manage throughflow	
Contact with other participants	Staggered start times and strict group management and briefings	
Equipment failure / issues	Ensure equipment is in good working order and is rigged correctly and is secure Ensure nor rigging pegs are protruding from ground	
Weather conditions – Hypothermia/ sunburn/ dehydration	Weather checked in advance and appropriate measures taken to safeguard participants
